SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Charles A. Case was an Abilene merchant and friend of President Dwight D. Eisenhower throughout the course of his life.

The correspondence contained in this collection is between Charles A. Case and General Eisenhower, Mamie Eisenhower, Ann Whitman, Thomas Stephens, Benjamin Fairless, General Schulz and Robert Clark. It was originally part of a scrapbook maintained by Mr. Case. The primary subjects documented in the correspondence include general birthday greetings and regrets about instances of illness. This collection also contains some correspondence regarding a 1952 reception held for Eisenhower in Case's home.

About 30 pages of the material in this collection are duplicated in the following collections:
