Welcome to the Dwight D. Eisenhower Presidential Library, Museum, and Boyhood Home of General of the Army and President of the United States Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The Eisenhower Cub Scout Leadership Patch is an opportunity to learn more about good character through the example of Dwight D. Eisenhower. He demonstrated the following six good character traits:

1. **Honesty:** Being truthful without being spiteful. A person who does not lie, cheat, or steal.
2. **Respect:** Treating both people and property with courtesy and honor, and acting in a manner so that others respect you.
3. **Responsibility:** Being reliable, dependable, and accountable in your actions. Not blaming others if things go wrong.
4. **Perseverance:** Not giving up, even when something is hard and you feel discouraged. Using self-discipline to follow through even when you feel like quitting.
5. **Courage:** Facing one's fears in difficult and challenging situations. The ability to accept disappointment and move forward despite it.
6. **Cooperation:** Working effectively and peacefully with others to accomplish common goals.

Visit the Permanent Galleries of the Eisenhower Museum to complete this activity sheet. If you don't finish it in one visit, return again and bring the sheet along with you.

Refer to the map to locate the exhibit needed to answer the questions. Start at the exhibit with the heading: "Abilene, 1892-1911."

Read the three exhibit panels about the Eisenhower family and the six Eisenhower boys in Abilene, Kansas. What does learning about Ike's family and childhood tell you about **HONESTY**?

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**West Point, 1911-1915**

Read the panel with the picture of Eisenhower in his cadet uniform. In what ways do you think he **PERSEVERED** after the injury ended his football career?

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**Fort Sam Houston  
San Antonio, Texas, 1915-1917**

Read the label and look at the baby cup and photo in the case about the Eisenhowers' first child, Doud Dwight. How do you think Eisenhower showed **COURAGE** after his three-year-old son died?

Study the panel about what Eisenhower did during World War I. In what ways did he show **PERSEVERANCE** during this time?

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**THE WAR  
The Allies**

Read about the Allies and why the United States joined the war. What do you think were the reasons why these three nations decided to **COOPERATE**?

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**D-DAY**

Study the panel and look at the exhibit case with the three documents: "In case of failure;" (transcription underneath) "Message of the Day," and the newspaper. In what ways do you think Eisenhower showed **RESPONSIBILITY** in planning for and carrying out the D-Day invasion?

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**SHAEF STRUCTURE**

Look at the panel and chart showing the allied command structure and find who Eisenhower reported to (left of his picture) and led (right of picture). In what ways do you think Eisenhower's ability to **COOPERATE** was important as he led the Allied Forces in Europe?

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**Showdown in Little Rock**

Read the panel and study the four documents about the crisis at Central High School in Little Rock, Arkansas. In what ways do you think Eisenhower showed his **RESPECT** for the people and the law during the Little Rock crisis?

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**Share what you have learned:**

Now that you have learned about the six good character traits and how General and President Eisenhower was a role model for them, share what you have learned with your family, friends, other scouts, and your scout leader.
